### **Financial Update**

Thanks to your incredible support, Kerr Street Mission is on track with our budget year-to-date, and we're excited to share that we surpassed our Send a Kid to Camp goal—raising \$260,000 against our \$250,000 target! ### **Looking to the Future**

Another question I am often asked is "What do you see in the future for KSM?"

Early this year we completed a comprehensive Strategic Planning Process to ensure we had a clear longer-term vision, and to establish a road map for the next few years. We spent considerable time reviewing the survey and focus group feedback gathered from all of our stakeholder groups. We also carefully considered statistics from our programming and community research. It was a very helpful and important process as we looked to the future.

#### Here are 2 Learnings that came from the research:

- Our space and systems can no longer efficiently accommodate the continually expanding and complex needs of our community.
- To continue to be responsive to the growing and evolving needs in our community we will need to undertake the related infrastructure growth our programs require.

#### Here are 3 important Actions identified as Next Steps:

- We will review the design of our programs to ensure we are maximizing the positive outcomes for those we serve.
- We need to explore options for space and systems to support the growing number of clients and client needs
- We will work to engage our community even more, as we move into the next phase of service and support, to ensure greater impact and sustainability.

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# Y SERVICES

Our clients don't fit a cookie cutter but the thing that they all have in common, as do all of us, is that they are navigating their current life circumstances. Some are new to Canada and trying to establish themselves by finding a place to live, a place to work and to raise their children. Others have been living on fixed income and are often isolated with minimal access to any extras and often not enough to meet necessities. Having a positive impact means that we have come alongside individuals and families to meet them where they are at and support them in their existing situations, and this connection provides meaningful support and relief as they navigate their challenging circumstances. Connection with someone else so that they are not alone in life can make a world of difference. Impact can be engaging in conversation, making a referral to a community partner, helping them fill in paperwork or establishing concrete plans to change their situation. Impact may be short term, limited to one or two interactions (such as giving someone an emergency food kit, a new backpack, sleeping bag) or it can be through longer term relationships.

One thing that they often have in common is that they are looking for community, a place to belong, to be seen and known.

There are two individuals who have recently been hospitalized for an extended period. The most recent hospital stay has been a very different experience for them from previous hospital stays when they were completely abandoned and alone. This time they have had a Kerr Street Mission (KSM) community of staff, volunteers and other clients walking alongside them, who visited them throughout their stays, spent time with them, brought them things they have needed and helped them to prepare for their discharge. Our community extended past the KSM walls. They are no longer alone and isolated.


# OPM

Our vision for the Child and Youth department is to facilitate development: to see our kids move up our ladder of program opportunities... kids, to youth, to Leaders in Training (LIT), to summer staff, and maybe even join the KSM staff one day. For the last few years, we have put a lot of attention and energy into our Jr High ages (grades 6-8.) As a result, we have seen tremendous growth in that age group and capacity has started to become an issue as we are consistently seeing 45-50 youth at our Friday Night Youth Group.

This September many of the youth we have spend years building relationships with have now gone into High School. Based on this transition we thought this was the perfect time to introduce High School drop-in times. We know how formative the High School stage is for their development, and these students need the opportunity to bond and support their peers. Having these extra drop-in times is helping to address some our capacity issues, spreading the youth to different days. In just the last couple weeks we have started to see grade nines coming together in a new and amazing ways... and we also see the older youth, (grades 11 and 12's) ones who used to come in previous years now returning because it's an age group closer to their own. It is so rewarding to see all our youth share, support and create a community of their own!

# OOD SERVICES

In 2024, we continue to see a significant upward trend in the needs around food security. We are consistently serving over 1000 individuals per week in our KSM Food Market. Our Choose Fresh program has seen a staggering increase in the number of individuals that rely on this critical food program. Our goal within Food Services is to provide a consistent and dependable supply of both staple food items and fresh products (meat, chicken, fish, milk, eggs, cheese etc.) Impact to us is the ability to make a positive change on the challenges of food security with our clients so they can focus on other aspects of their lives and foster a sense of community, respect, and dignity.
